about Sidney Sime

Sidney Sime (1867 - 1941) was an English artist, illustrator and caricaturist, mostly remembered for his fantastic and satirical artwork, especially his story illustrations for Irish author Lord Dunsany.

He was born in Manchester in poverty and went down the mines as a boy. He later studied at the Liverpool School of Art and has been described as "the biggest thing to come out of Liverpool before the Beatles".

Sime quickly became famous for drawings and illustrations with fantastic themes, with a presence in *The Idler* and the *Pall Mall Gazette*. Underlying his work was biting

satire, especially aimed at the rich and at politicians.

The artist owned Crown Cottage at Worplesdon and spent much of his time here during the latter part of his life. The Gallery at the Memorial Hall was opened in 1956 with proceeds from the sale of Crown Cottage, on the death of his widow Mary Sime.

The curator of the small gallery, Anne Philps, will be at our lunch to show guests around.
